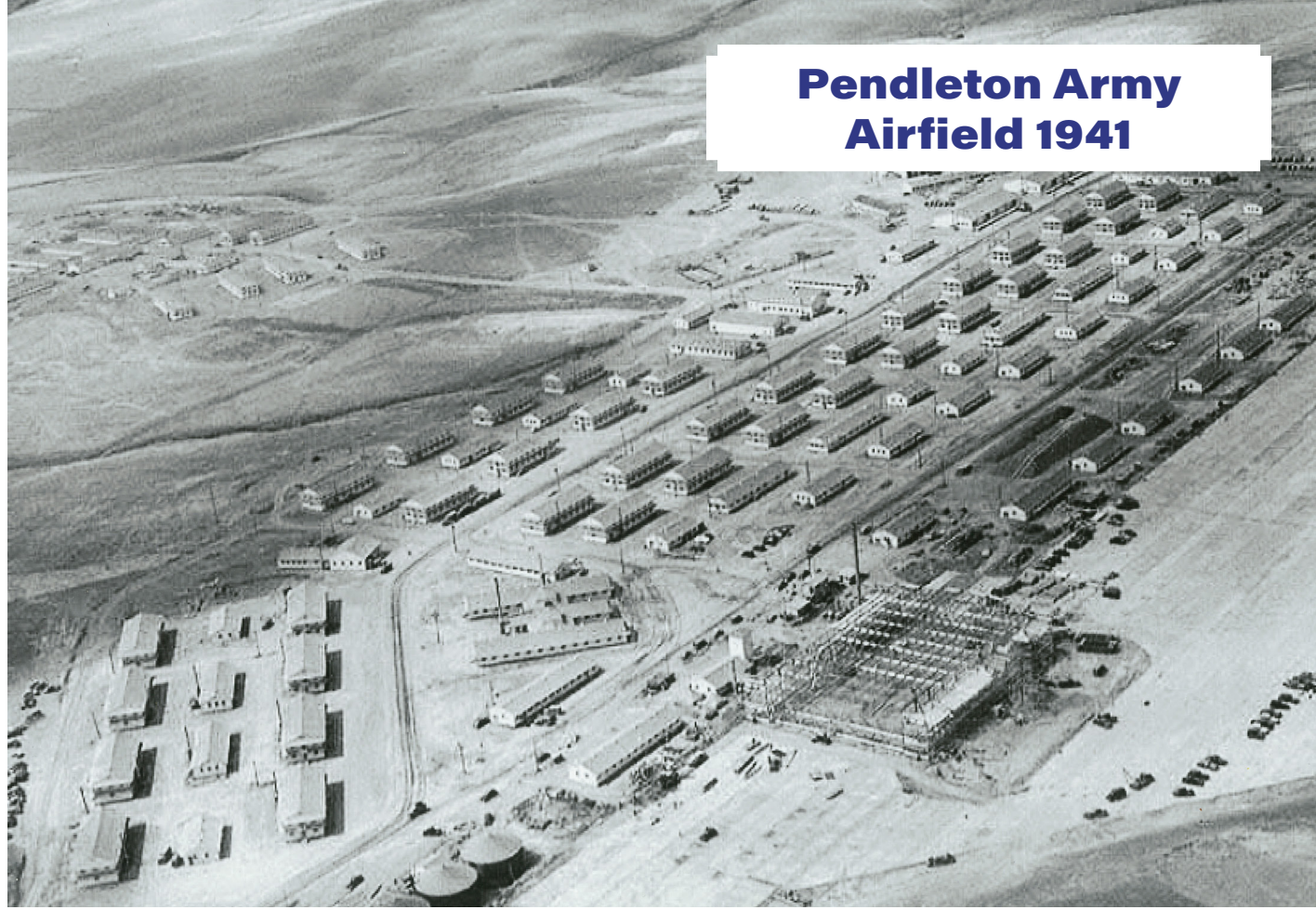

History

The mission of the Pendleton Air Museum is exclusively for charitable, scientific, historical, and educational purposes, more specifically to acquire, preserve, interpret, demonstrate and display, for public enjoyment and education. Items that represent the history of the Pendleton Army Air Base and the role played by the public and the surrounding area.

Starting as a Hub for Air-mail in 1930, until the building of the Army Air Field in February of 1941, from the 17th Bombardment and their 4 Squadrons of B-25 North American Mitchell Bombers and the 330th Maintenance Group, ending with the 555th unit of infantry men. Today it houses a group of future aerial vehicles and National Guard of Chinooks.
